## **REGISTRATION RULES**

- For the Target event, Archers may compete in one of the following classes:
  - Recurve (with sights)
  - Barebow Recurve (no sights),
  - Compound Fingers (with sights)
  - Barebow Compound (no sights)
  - Compound Release
- For the Field event, Archers may compete in one of the following classes:
  - Traditional Long Bow / Recurve
  - Recurve (with sights) / Release
  - Compound Fingers (with sights)
  - Compound Release (with sights)
  - Barebow Compound
- Participants must provide their own bows and a minimum of six (6) matching arrows.
- Depending on entries, age divisions may be combined for competition, but separated for scoring.

## **FORMAT / RULES**

### Target - Monday & Tuesday

- NAA rules will govern shoot.
- The "900" American round will be shot each day.
- 90 Arrows will be shot as follows:
  - 30 arrows from 60 yards – Five ends of six arrows
  - 30 arrows from 50 yards – Five ends of six arrows
  - 30 arrows from 40 yards – Five ends of six arrows
- Five minutes will be allowed for each end.
- "X" ring hits will be kept on the scorecard by all competitors and used as a tie-breaker.
- In event of equipment failure, a 30-minute repair time will be allowed with no disruption of the shooting line. A maximum of two ends may be made up.
- Field glasses or scopes are permitted for spotting arrow hits. Scopes may be placed on the shooting line provided they do not disrupt the shooting of the adjacent archer. Scopes shall be removed from the line between ends if not utilized by the other archer shooting in that space.
- No broadheads will be permitted.
- Regulation FITA 122-centimeter (48-inch) five-color target faces will be used.
- Dividing lines are part of the higher scoring. The arrow shaft must only touch the color or dividing line between scoring zones to score the higher value.

## **FORMAT / RULES - Target** (continued)

- Hits will not be marked on the target face. Witnessed bounce out and pass through arrows will be shot over at the end of the distance as make-up arrows. If the bounce out destroys an arrow in the target, then it is a “Robin Hood” and will score the value of the arrow it destroyed.
- Special archery attire will not be required.
- Participants must present their HWSG ID Badge at the venue check-in desk between 8:00 and 8:30 each morning of competition.
- Open practice from 8:30 am to 9:00 am, daily.
- Note: Target Archery is an event in the 2009 Summer National Senior Games. Since the Huntsman World Senior Games is a qualifier for the 2009 Summer National Senior Games, all first, second and third place winners; all first, second and third place winners from Utah; and all Archers meeting the NSGA minimum performance standards for Target Archery at the Huntsman World Senior Games will qualify for entry into the 2009 Summer National Senior Games.

## **Field - Wednesday & Thursday**

- NFAA rules will govern shoot.
- Wednesday – Field Animal Round – 28 Targets
- Thursday – 3-D Animal – 20 Targets

## **MEDALS**

In each event, class, and age division, Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded to the top three scores. Medals for Target Archery will be awarded after the event on Tuesday and medals for Field Archery will be awarded at the Field Archery Sport Social.
